

In addition to the vacant Treasurer position, we also have other positions available:

- 1. <u>Executive Officer</u>: In charge of work parties, range maintenance and repairs, etc. Orders supplies as needed (cardboard, wood for frames, etc.).
- 2. <u>Secretary</u>: Handles new member and renewal applications, emailing / corresponding with members, maintains all records of the Club, etc. We already have an Assistant Secretary (Mike Lawler) in place to assist as needed! Computer proficiency, word processing and spreadsheet creation/maintenance is recommended.
- 3. <u>Newsletter Editor</u>: Publishes news and special reports from the ASC Board. Required to publish at least 4 newsletters a year and preferably to be published quarterly to satisfy NRA rules. Currently use Microsoft Publisher to publish *The Flyer*, but if you want to start from scratch, you are welcome to use other software. Contact ASC VP for more information.
- 4. <u>Director</u>: There are director-at-large openings on the Board also. These directors often take on duties to assist other Board members or they run special events/programs such as shooting matches.

A Special Election Edition of the *The Flyer* has already been published that detailed the duties of these positions. (See ASC website for more information.) Again, if our Club is to survive, we have to have a steady supply of volunteers to serve on the ASC Board. Please contact us to help continue the success of the ASC.



Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot.



LOCK ETIQUETTE..

It has been brought to our attention by 4-H Center personnel that some ASC members do not know how to lock the ASC range gate lock properly. On more than one occasion, the 4-H staff have been locked out of the range when trying to open the gate for their youth programs. To get in the gate, they had to cut the ASC chain. The problem arises when our ASC members lock our combination lock directly into the chain instead of being properly interlocked into the 4-H Center's key padlock. Interlocking the locks gives both us and the Center access. All ASC members should already know how to lock the lock properly if they paid attention during orientation. The ASC Board has become weary of hearing about and discussing the failure of our members to follow simple instructions. As one 4-H Center staff member queried: "how can we trust folks with guns on our range if they cannot follow instructions to lock a lock properly?" The ASC Board agrees. We are putting out this instruction with pictures as a final warning. ASC members that cannot follow these instructions may be locked out of the range and prohibited from coming back without refund. See pictures below. Don't be the first ASC member that we lock out of the range!

Note how locks are <u>properly</u> interlocked so that ASC members and 4-H Center staff can unlock the chain by unlocking their respective locks.

We placed black tape over the links to try to discourage improperly locking of ASC lock into chain links. DO NOT REMOVE TAPE.

Youth Training Opportunity



ASC Board Disciplinary Actions - Rule Violations Reported

RULE VIOLATIONS REPORTED IN MAY/JUNE 2018:

- Member # 749 Adjusted Skeet machine without authorization. ASC Board strongly warned member that no further violations will be tolerated. Skeet/trap privileges may be revoked or membership may be revoked for future violations. NOTE TO ALL MEMBERS: Tampering or adjusting skeet machines is grounds for immediate dismissal from the Club and you will be responsible for any and all damages caused to machines.
- 4-H staff locked out of range by ASC improperly locking gate locks. Matter is being investigated. NOTE TO ALL MEMBERS: Our lock is to be interlocked into the 4-H Center's lock. Do not lock our lock into the chain. That locks the Center out of the range because they do not have nor should they be given the ASC lock combination.
