SAFETY IS JOB ONE!

Ladies and Gents I want to send out a reminder on how important understanding who is the RSO and what the status of the range is. Recently we had an incident where the Conference Center rented out the Short Range Berm (SRB) but we did not close the range. The organization was the first one on the range but they did NOT assume the RSO duty because they were not members. This is a failure on the Conference Center's part. There should have been an RSO assigned to them, and the board of directors is taking that for action.

A little while later a member came along to shoot. He saw the other people on the range and assumed they had the RSO duty because they were there first. The member used the far end of the 50 yd range. After a while the member had stopped shooting for a break and the other group went down range at the short range berm but did not say anything to the member. The other member went back to go shooting however without looking back at the SRB.

Fortunately, another member saw what was going on and called a cease fire and discussed the issue with the group and the member. There was some frustration all around due to the situation.

Some take aways from this lesson:

- 1. As a person coming to the range, always find out who the RSO is. Don't assume it is just someone else. Actually find out who the individual is.
- 2. Be aware of your surroundings. Yes, the other group went down range without calling the range cold, but as safety conscious members we should always be looking out for safety violations. Several years ago we

had a Boy Scout show up on the top of our berm while shooting. Members had to call a cease fire. Safety incidents can happen anytime.

The point of bringing this to everyone's attention is that we can all use a refresher that we are responsible for the safety of our club, no matter who is on the line. Safety is Always Job One. Please pay attention to what is going on and make sure you say something if there is an issue. As always if there are any issues that you cannot resolve, then please drop the Board a line and we will be more than happy to help clarify and resolve any concerns.



Airfield shooting club is looks for a new shotgun director. The following paragraph outlines the duties and responsibilities of this position

The Shotgun Director shall be responsible for maintaining and accounting for the supply of clay targets. He/She shall also oversee maintenance of the skeet and trap machines. He/She shall coordinate with the Secretary (who shall have the logs from the shotgun ranges) to account for targets thrown and shall be responsible for billing members for targets on a schedule as determined by the Board. The Shotgun Director shall be responsible for submitting all shotgun-related reports to the governing bodies of the various shotgun sports offered by ASC. These include, but are not limited to: National Skeet Shooting Association, Virginia Skeet Shooting Association, Amateur Trap Association, etc.
